MHAA Treasurer's Report for January 2024

As of 15 January 2024 we have \$4,658.68 in our bank account and \$2843.80 in our PayPal account, with the Treasurer holding \$73 in petty cash. Our monthly payment of \$32.44 for Google gSuite was paid on the 1st of the month, and \$15.99 was paid for Zoom on the 15th.

This month we received \$226.32 in dues for 2 new members and 8 membership renewals. We also received \$150 from Opus 40 for an event in December.

#### MHAA Membership Report for January 2024

As of 15 January 2024 the club has 74 paid members in good standing, of which 4 are students. This month we gained 2 new members, with 8 renewals, while there are currently 10 lapsed memberships, of which 2 are long-time members who have not renewed in over a year, and 7 have only expired in the last month. There are 5 more memberships which will lapse in the next month if not renewed.

Our Slack workspace has 78 "regular" members, which does not include 20 deactivated accounts or 39 invitations sent out but not used. Of those 78 regular members, 28 are classified as "active" this month for billing purposes (though we are not actually billed, since we use the free service). Our mailing list on groups.io, which is for both members and non-members interested in our activities, now has 108 subscribers. We have over 2520 followers on our site on Meetup.com (they call them "members," but they are not paid MHAA members). On Facebook our page has1035 followers (in the United States — the few others are probably fake accounts), and our Instagram account has 125 followers.

#### **Directions To The Star Party Site**

Lake Taghkanic State Park is in the town Ancram, NY. The park entrance is on the Taconic Parkway 10 minutes north of the exit used for Wilcox park.

Star Parties at Lake Taghanic are held in the West Parking lot, next to the beach. The skies are darker than in Wilcox, with less stray light to deal with. The horizon is also much lower, especially to the south and east, making many more targets possible.

**IMPORTANT:** all events at Lake Taghkanic State Park require an **RSVP** which includes license plate number of the car you are bringing (please do so via <u>Meetup</u>). The park is patrolled by state police, and all non registered cars will be ticketted and risk our use of the park.

## General Information:

• Dates listed for star parties are the primary dates. The rain date is the following night unless otherwise noted. Only one session is held for a given weekend, usually on the primary date, Friday, unless postponed (usually due to inclement weather) to the backup date, Saturday. Exceptions to this are noted in the "Scheduled Events" section above.

• All outdoor events are FREE! All are welcome. If you bring small children, it is <u>your</u> responsibility to keep a close eye on them. Please do not bring white-light flashlights. Instead, bring a red astronomer's flashlight or an ordinary flashlight covered with several layers of red cellophane. If in doubt about the weather, check the status of the event at <u>www.midhudsonastro.org</u>.
