#### MHAA Treasurer's Report for July 2024

As of 14 July 2024 we have \$4,408.84 in our bank account and \$3,027.90 in our PayPal account, with the Treasurer holding \$265 in petty cash. Our monthly payment for Google gSuite went down to \$36.59 this month after we deleted one unused account. We will pay \$15.99 on the 15th for Zoom Pro for one month.

This month we took in \$100.44 in dues for 4 renewing members, and \$201.32 for 9 new members (one of them a student). We received a donation of \$200 when some of our members took telescopes to a bachelorette party, and we received a \$25 donation from a member.

As I mentioned last month, I have been informed by Meetup that the price for their services will be going up to \$178.99 every 6 months, an increase of \$72.13, or 67%. I have not yet received that bill.

#### MHAA Membership Report for July 2024

As of 14 July 2024 the club has 99 members in good standing, of which 6 are students. This month we gained 9 new members, including another student, with 4 members renewing, while there are currently 9 lapsed memberships. We have 97 members on Slack, of which only 34 have been active this past month. There are 116 people signed up for our groups.io mailing list. On social media, we have over 2,650 followers on Meetup.com, 1,168 followers on Facebook, and 162 followers on Instagram.

I now understand the software for managing memberships on our new website enough that I have been creating accounts for all new members and whenever an existing member renews. There were some bumps along the way, but I think they are all smoothed out now. I've worked my way back through the list of people who have paid dues since March and sent them notices to set a password on their new account. I've still got about a quarter of the list of members to put into the new system, but I expect that to be completed by the next meeting. After everybody is in the system we will run some tests to compare the new database with the old spreadsheet, and when that is done the new database will become the primary membership list.

The new website is based on software called WordPress which was originally designed for blogs and static web pages, which means that it should be fairly easy to use to post club information and news about events. I plan to test this out by posting this report to the blog on that site, though I'm not sure if it easy for visitors to view yet.

### **Directions To The Star Party Site**

<u>Lake Taghkanic State Park</u> is in the town Ancram, NY. The park entrance is on the Taconic Parkway 10 minutes north of the exit used for Wilcox park.

Star Parties at Lake Taghanic are held in the West Parking lot, next to the beach. The skies are darker than in Wilcox, with less stray light to deal with. The horizon is also much lower, especially to the south and east, making many more targets possible.

**IMPORTANT:** all events at Lake Taghkanic State Park require an **RSVP** which includes license plate number of the car you are bringing (please do so via <u>Meetup</u>). The park is patrolled by state police, and all non registered cars will be ticketted and risk our use of the park.

# General Information:

- Dates listed for star parties are the primary dates. The rain date is the following night unless otherwise noted. Only one session is held for a given weekend, usually on the primary date, Friday, unless postponed (usually due to inclement weather) to the backup date, Saturday. Exceptions to this are noted in the "Scheduled Events" section above.
- All outdoor events are FREE! All are welcome. If you bring small children, it is <u>your</u> responsibility to keep a close eye on them. Please do not bring white-light flashlights. Instead, bring a red astronomer's flashlight or an ordinary flashlight covered with several layers of red cellophane. If in doubt about the weather, check the status of the event at <u>www.midhudsonastro.org</u>.
